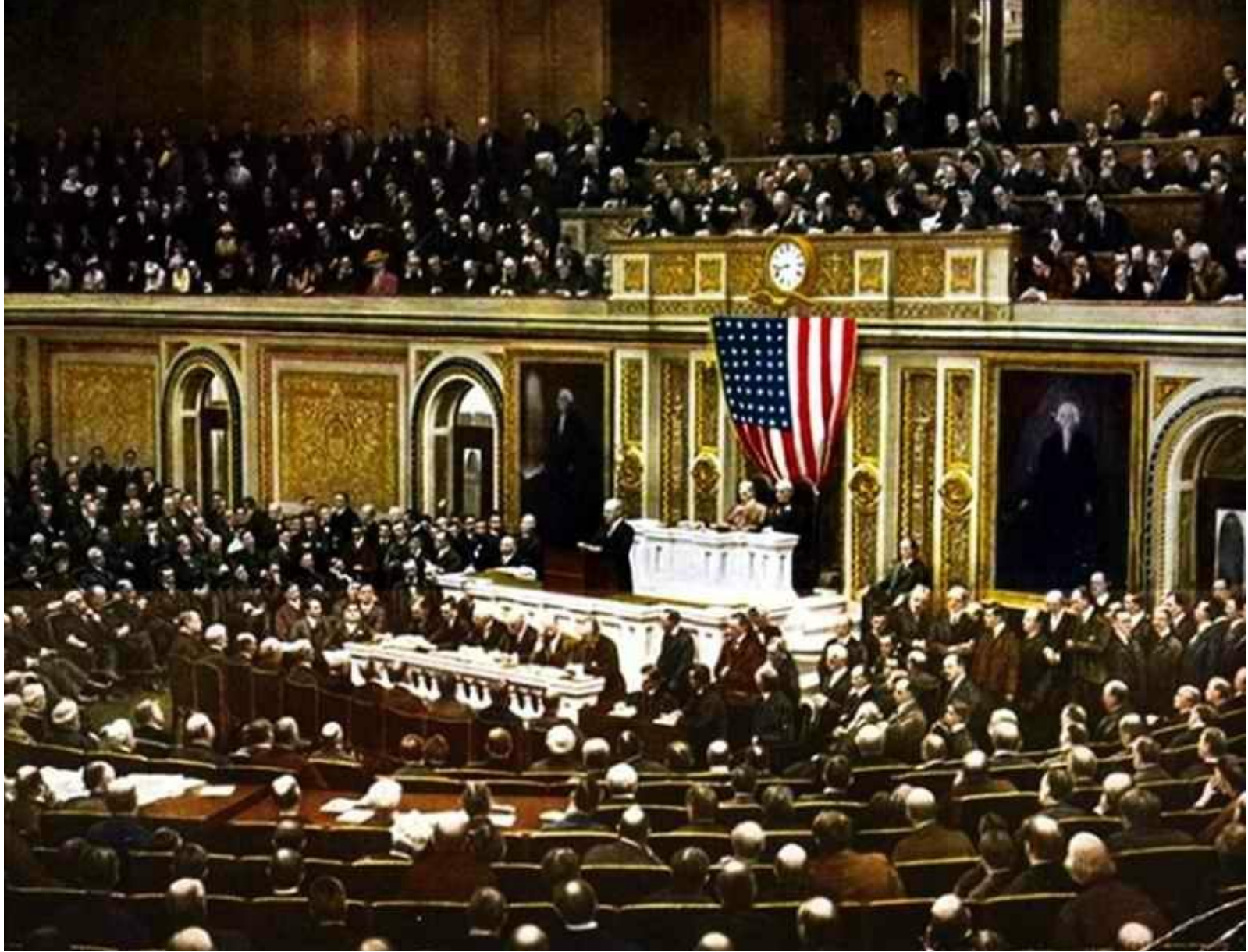

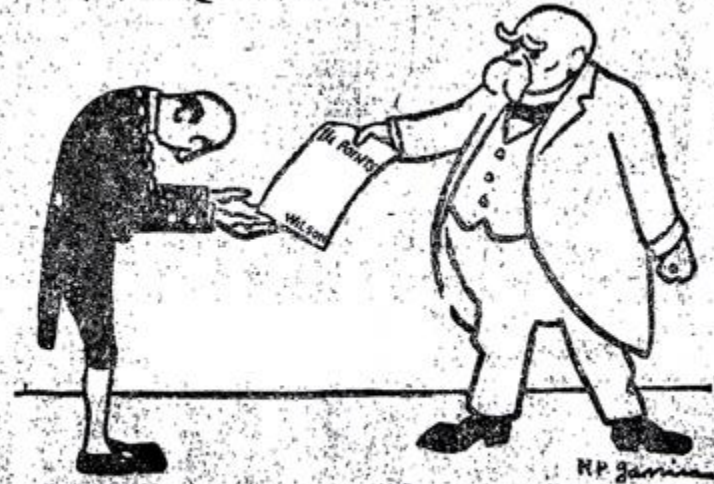

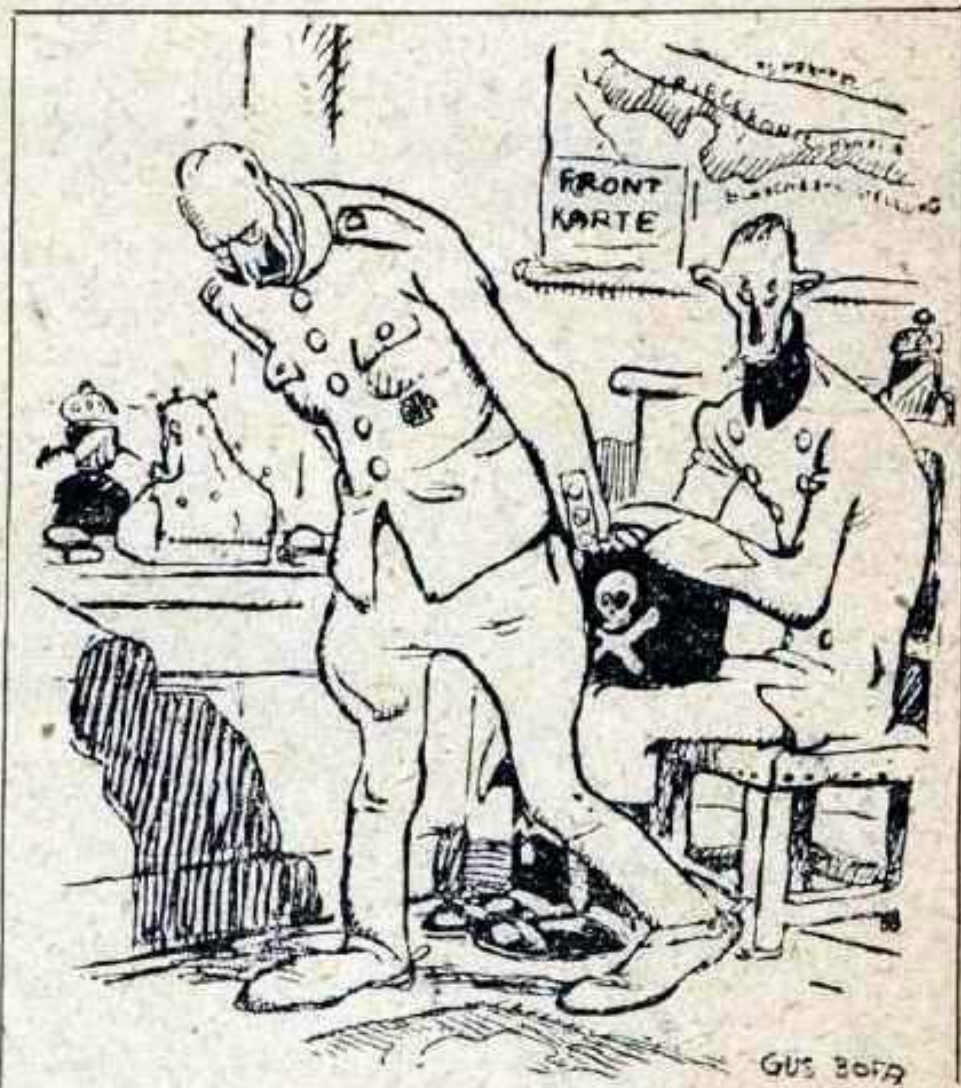

From President Wilson's Address to Congress To-Day.
"We have the ambition of German greatness, and liberty is nothing to this generation than respect of it. We do not wish to liberty but to be there to see that her substance be broken to pieces. We do not wish to fight but rather with arms or with better arrangements of trade, in order to establish her with us as one of the other great nations of the world to contribute to justice and the good of the world."
"We wish for peace to avoid a state of equality among the peoples of the world in which we are not interested at all."
"We do not propose to expand by our deep admirability or readiness of our substance. We do not propose, we want peace and we wish to see the world as a whole to be united in a common effort for the good of the world."
